Club Clean-Up Day was a great success — thank you to all the members who showed up to help. The weather was perfect, and so much was accomplished. High School Trap

The Central/Logan High School Trap Team concluded its 2026 regular season on May 27 with the annual Awards/Fun Night. This spring, the team had 38 athletes, including 13 new members and one transfer from another school.

The top five shooters on the team were Aiden Schulze (24.8 average), Cole Hasburgh (23.3 average), Drew Hass (23.0 average), Aiden Martin (22.4 average), and William Buckley (21.9 average). Aiden S., Cole, and Drew also finished in the top 25 in the conference's male division. Aiden S. finished 1st overall in the conference out of 314 competitors, and even more impressively, he placed 2nd statewide. This spring, 3,541 athletes competed statewide.

Lillian Turner was the team's top female shooter with an average of 20.6. Lillian, along with teammate Grace Hellerud, finished among the top 25 females in the conference. Two team members shot 50 straights during the season: Drew H. had one, and Aiden S. had three. Six athletes shot 25 straights: Drew Hass (4), Cole H. (2), Sam Pogreba (2), William Buckley (1), and Sam Wilke (1). Aiden S. and Drew each had two "oh-so-close" 49s. The team also recorded twenty-one "oh-so-close" 24s.

The team finished 6th overall in the conference. The Clay Target League State Tournament was held June 6–7 in Rome, WI. Central/Logan had 21 athletes competing. Aiden S. led the team with a 96, followed by Aiden Martin with a 95 and Drew H. with a 94. Gabe Yang shot a 92, and both Izzy Thomsen and Ty Ericksmon shot 90. For many team members, this was their first state competition.

Nationals will be held July 8–12 in Mason, MI. This year, five athletes will compete in both the team and individual events: Drew H., Benji Wood, Aiden M., Lillian T., and Cole H. They will be competing against the very best in the nation, and we are extremely proud to have them representing the team at this level. Scores can be followed on the US Clay Target League Nationals website under the Leaderboard. Team competition takes place on Friday, July 10, with individual competition on Saturday, July 11. Finals will be held on Sunday, July 12. You can also follow the team on Facebook at *Central-Logan Trap Team*.

The team would like to thank the Chaseburg Rod and Gun Club and the many club members who volunteer their time each week to coach and support the athletes. The team would not be where it is today without this continued commitment from everyone. Thank you!

Aquinas finished 6th in their conference, with strong improvement shown by all athletes. Alexis Stupi earned 3rd place among female competitors at State. Despite the windy conditions, it was an excellent State meet for the team.

Two Person Trap League

Competition shooting was completed on June 9. A total of 102 men, women, and teenagers competed on 51 teams across 11 divisions, with teams assigned to divisions based on ability. Cash prizes were awarded to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in every division, with equal payouts across all divisions. These prizes come from a portion of each shooter's entry fee.

Final team results are posted on the Trap Page of the website. The names of all teams and shooters, along with their division assignments, are listed there as well.

The party shoot and steak fry were held on June 16. Many thanks to all the shooters who participated and for their support of this important fundraiser for our club.

Four Person Trap League

Four Person League begins on June 23 and runs for nine weeks of competition shooting. Each shooter will shoot 50 birds every Tuesday. Sign-up takes place on the first night; if you cannot attend that evening, you may be able to sign up during the second week, though you will need to shoot 100 birds to catch up.

Teams are placed into divisions according to ability, ranging from expert to beginner. Shooter ages vary from as old as 85 to as young as 12 (younger shooters participate with their parents). Shooting begins at 2 p.m. each Tuesday, and all shooters must be signed up by 8 p.m. You may shoot at whatever time works best for you. You do not need to shoot at the same time as your teammates, and you may choose a different time each week.

If you would like to shoot but do not have enough people for a team, stop down on June 23 or June 30 — there are always teams looking for one or two shooters to fill out a roster.

The cost is \$150 per shooter for the nine weeks of shooting, with a party shoot and steak fry on the tenth week. The entry fee covers the cost of clay birds, maintenance expenses, prize money, wages for the high school students who score and load the trap houses, cleanup, and a small profit for the club.

Come on out for some good, clean fun and throw a little lead into the air!

Trout Release

The trout release was held Tuesday, April 28. A total of 1,499 Rainbow Trout were released. Students from St. Matthew's in Stoddard helped gather and release the trout. Family members of Chad Erickson joined at Chad Erickson Park, and additional trout were released at Veterans Memorial Park in West Salem. Thank you, Mark, for taking care of the fish!

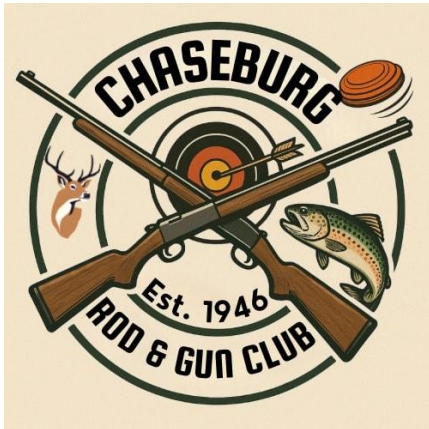
